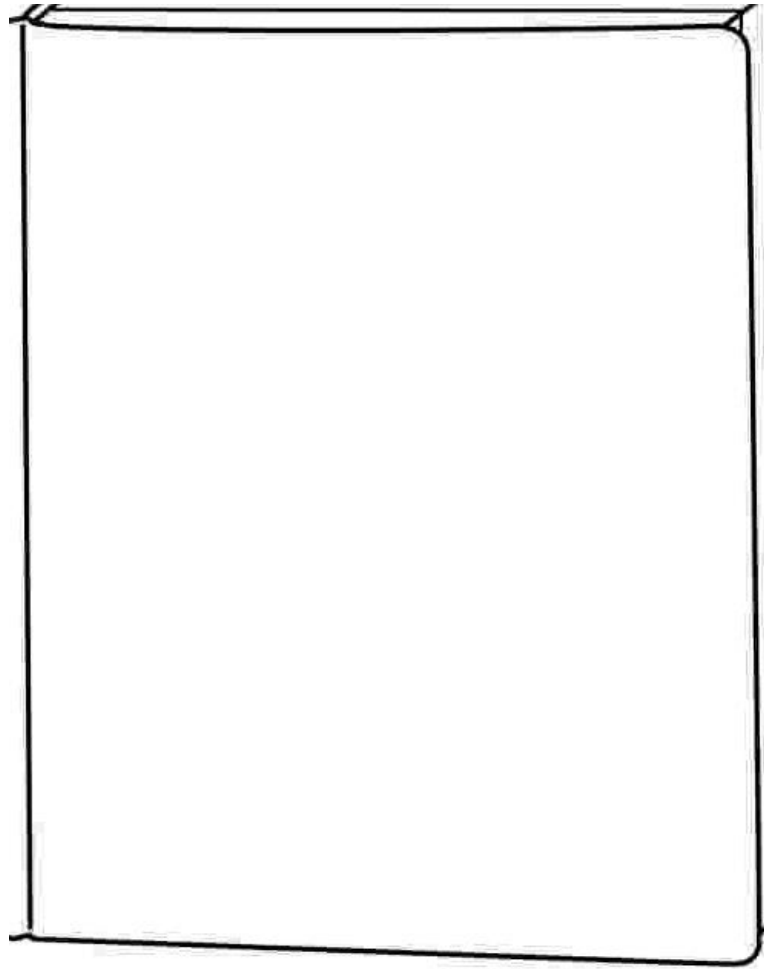

In this week's Parashah, we read about the last three of the ten plagues and the dramatic departure of the Jewish People from Mitzrayim (Egypt). As the 210 years of slavery come to an end, Moshe explains to the people that each year they will remember this great day of liberation by eating matzah and by telling their children of the extraordinary events that led to their freedom. Thus is born the Festival of Pesach and the amazing experience that we call the Seder.

In class this week, we have discussed the Seder manual (known as the Haggadah). The crucial section of the Haggadah is 'Maggid' in which, at the Seder, we relate the story of this week's Parashah.
